Course Objective

Economic History is a one-term course designed for the second year students in the Department of Economics. The aim of the course is to acquaint students with the historical development of economic processes and institutions; changes in production, distribution and consumption patterns and the unique development of factors of production in the world in general and Western European context in particular. The course is taught with the understanding that economic history is a branch of social sciences situated in between economy and history. While concepts and methods of history are applied to the realm of economics and a narration of successive economic events are given; due emphasis is also put on the description and evaluation of economic institutions. This approach facilitates the comparative analysis of regional, national and international economic developments in a historical context.

Course Outline

The course starts with the introductions of several concepts and definitions. Then, the economic understandings of ancient civilizations, medieval world and pre-capitalist world will be studied. Afterwards, the emergence of modern economy at the dawn of industrial revolution will be examined. Together with industrial revolution, modern economy with many new institutions will be introduced and modern world economy with modern civilizations will be studied until 21st century.
